Power of Jesus' Body to Yours Joseph Prince Daily Devotional

Matthew 26:26 ... "Take, eat; this is My body."

Can you imagine the Lord sick, nursing a cold or fever while He walked on earth? No, our Lord Jesus was never sick! He was vibrant, full of life and full of health. When He told His disciples, "Take, eat; this is My body", they could practically visualize what it meant because they had lived and walked with this Man. They had seen people without hands or feet made whole when they touched His body. (Matthew 15:30–31)


Even His clothes were soaked with His health! A woman who had a bleeding condition for 12 years—no doctor could cure her—was healed immediately when she touched the hem of His garment. If the hem of His garment was soaked with His health, vibrancy, energy and divine radiance, how much more His body!

You know, some of the most encouraging verses in the Gospels are these: "And as many as touched Him were made well" (Mark 6:56), for "power went out from Him and healed them all". (Luke 6:19) I love those verses! That is our Jesus!

The Bible says that they put sick people along the streets, and Jesus walked around, touched them and healed them. Now, you see movie stars doing this: They run here and there, they slap their fans' hands, but nobody gets healed. But wherever Jesus walked, whoever He touched, He healed. Picture this: A trail of people. Those in front of Jesus are lying down, but those behind Him whom He has touched are leaping with joy and following Him! That is how Jesus healed the sick.

So that night, when He said, "Take, eat; this is My body," as He broke the bread and gave it to His disciples to eat, they knew what it meant. They were probably thinking, "We are going to ingest His health into our bodies! Hallelujah!"

That is what you must believe when you partake of the Holy Communion. It is not just a ritual or symbolic act. No, you must believe that He is the true bread from heaven who took your cancer, diabetes and heart disease, so that you can have His supernatural health! And when you eat of His broken body with this revelation, you will have life in abundance and the health of the Lord!

Pastoral Thought

The word kind is defined as having or showing a gentle nature and a desire to help others. It's further defined as wanting to do good things and to bring happiness to others. While the dictionary's focuses on outward actions, kind deeds alone do not make you a kind person. It is not what one does that is most important to God. Instead, it is why one does it. God is concerned about your motive or the reason for doing something.

1 Corinthians 16: 14 states "Let all that you do be done with love." If your acts of kindness are rooted in love, then you might be a kind person. Yes, I said you might be a kind person. Jesus said "but if you love only those that love you, what credit is that to you? For even the unbelievers love those that love them." Luke 6:32.

If you are only kind to those that are kind to you, you are not a kind person yet. If your are saved then the spirit of God is working to develop kindness in you as a fruit of the spirit. (Gal 5:22-23). Most of us need superhuman strength to be kind to folk who a not kind to us. This strength comes from the Spirit of God who is in every believer. He is there to help you love the unlovable and be kind to the unkind.

Why should we be kind to everyone? Aside from the fact that God has commanded us to love one another, there are spiritual and physical benefits. Proverbs 19:17 tells us that if we help the poor, we are lending to the Lord and He will repay us. Here's the deal, God will not only pay you back the amount loaned but He will pay you good interest as well.

Henry Bosch provides the following illustration. A father once gave his son a half dollar, telling him to do with it as he pleased. Later when he asked about it, the little fellow said he had lent it to someone. "Did you get good security," inquired the father. "Yes, I gave it to a poor beggar who who looked hungry." "O! How foolish you are you will never get it back," said the father. But dad, I have the greatest security. For the Bible says he that gives to the poor lends to the Lord". Thinking this over, the Christian father was so pleased he gave his son another half dollar! "See," said the little boy "I told you I'd get it again. Only I didn't think it would come this soon."

The Lord repays in what you need: health, strength, wealth, and peace. He repays in things money can't buy. Try Him today.
